

Instructions for use of the EDC safety kit type WB-01

This everyday carry safety kit includes the **HURRICANE** self-defense spray and a glass breaker. The practical plastic body fits comfortably in the hand and provides partial protection for your fingers during use.



Instructions for breaking glass

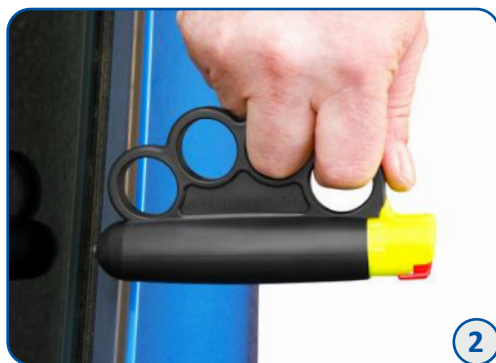
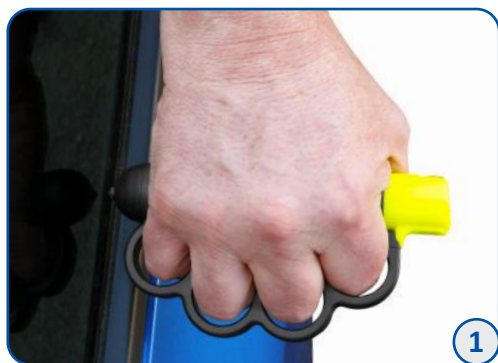
1. **Preparation and grip:** When you need to break glass, hold the body of the glass breaker in your palm by inserting your fingers through the designated holes. Make sure to hold the breaker horizontally, with the back of your hand facing upward and the tip pointing straight at the glass (*see Fig. 1*).

Take extra care when breaking glass to avoid injury. We recommend using protective equipment such as **safety goggles and gloves**. In extreme cases, at least turn your face away from the glass and keep your eyes closed during the strike. This will provide partial protection against flying glass fragments.

2. **Breaking the glass:** Break the glass with a **quick, light flick of the wrist**. The power of the strike is not as important as its speed. **Caution:** The tip of the breaker must be **perpendicular to the glass surface** to ensure safe and effective breaking.

If there is a risk of delay, you can also break the glass without holding the body of the glass breaker in your palm (*see Fig. 2*). Simply grasp it with your fingers and follow the same procedure as described in previous paragraph.

After breaking the glass, carefully remove any shards from the area before continuing, to avoid injury.



- This action should only be performed in justified situations and in accordance with the law (as a last resort in an emergency).
- When breaking a car window, always aim for a corner of the window (about 10 cm from the edge), where the glass is least flexible and most likely to shatter. This tool is intended for emergency breaking of side or rear windows only. The windshield has a special structure and cannot be broken effectively in this way.
- Please note that the construction, quality, and type of windows may vary significantly depending on the type of vehicle. If the glass does not break on the first attempt, repeat the action as needed.

Use of HURRICANE defensive spray

This EDC safety kit contains **non-flammable** spray in a **JET form** with a shooting range **up to 3 m**. When in danger, point the spray away from you and turn the spray button rightward (*see Fig. 3*). Point the valve toward the attacker and by pressing the button, release the spray in **short 1-second intervals (downwind)**.

Never use against the direction of the wind. Do not use in small or enclosed spaces (such as a lift or a car) **and at a distance shorter than 1 m** as this may endanger the health of the user herself. Hitting the attacker's face causes intense sore eyes and coughing. The attacker is disoriented for approx. 30 minutes.



- **Warning:** The defensive spray is designed for self-defence only. Its misuse is prosecuted. The spray may not be used against children, pregnant women, old and ill persons.

Causes skin irritation. Causes serious eye irritation. May cause respiratory irritation. Avoid contact with skin and eyes. Keep container in a well-ventilated place. Do not breathe spray. **Keep out of the reach of children.**

Keep away from heat, hot surfaces, sparks, open flames and other ignition sources. No smoking. Pressurized container: Do not pierce or burn, even after use. Protect from sunlight. Do not expose to temperatures exceeding 50 °C / 122 °F.

- **First aid: IF IN EYES:** Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. **IF ON SKIN:** Wash with plenty of water and soap. Do not use creams, ointments and oils. In case of accident by inhalation: remove casualty to fresh air and keep at rest. If the problems persist even after 1 hour, seek immediate medical advice. If swallowed, seek medical advice immediately and show this container or label.
- Spray contains 10% Oleoresin Capsicum (OC irritant) and ethanol. 26% by mass of the contents are flammable. Date of expiration at the bottom of the spray can.

Installing the spare spray

After use, or when the spray has expired, remove the spray container from the kit. Insert a new **HURRICANE** defensive spray into the opening in the body of the window breaker, making sure the projection on the spray head fits securely into the cutout on the plastic body (see Fig. 4). Dispose of the used spray as hazardous waste.

If the spray cannot be removed easily, warm the upper part of the plastic body using a hairdryer or by placing it in warm water. **Do not immerse the entire kit – only the top part containing the spray.**

We recommend replacing the spray with a new one after each use, even if some of the active substance remains in the container.



Method of wearing the EDC safety kit

The safety kit is designed to be carried in a bag, purse, or pocket, or stored in a car away from direct sunlight. **Caution:** Use extra care when carrying the kit in a pocket to avoid accidental activation of the defensive spray. We recommend always keeping the spray securely locked to prevent unintentional use.

Recommendations and warnings

- Before use, make sure the glass breaker and defensive spray are in good condition and not damaged.
- Check the expiry date of the defensive spray regularly and replace it if needed.
- **Keep the device out of reach of children and unauthorized persons.**
- The grip is designed to safely hold only **HURRICANE** spray from ESP. Using other types of spray may lead to difficulties or reduce the effectiveness of the safety kit.
- Device can be sold only to persons older than 18 years.
